**BRIEF INDUSTRIAL PROFILE OF
DISTRICT
SHRI MUKTSAR SAHIB**



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1. GENERAL CHARACTERISTICS OF THE DISTRICT

Muktsar was created as a new district on 7 November 1995 by taking out Muktsar subdivision of Faridkot District which was earlier i.e. before 7 August 1972 subdivision of Firozpur District. From this a reference can be drawn that the history of the present Muktsar District is not very much different from the history of earlier Firozpur District.

Muktsar district is bounded by States of Rajasthan and Haryana in the South side, Firozpur in West side, district Faridkot in North side and Bathinda in the East side. Sri Muktsar Sahib District is located in South Western Zone of Punjab.

1.1 LOCATION & GEOGRAPHICAL AREA.

The District lies between 30° 69' and 29° 87' North. latitude and 74° 21' and 74° 86' East Longitude.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY

Muktsar district is located on the Punjab plain which in a macro regional context forms a part of great Satluj Ganga plain. It is a low lying flat area. The flatness of the topography is indicated by the fact that only one contour line is passing through the district. This contour line runs from southeast towards north-west and near passes through the east of Muktsar town. It divides the district into two halves. In one half it is below 200m. the surface of the district is depositional plain which was formed by alluviation by the rivers in the remote past.

1.3 AVAILABILITY OF MINERALS

Saltpetre is a general trade name for all nitrates of sodium, potassium and calcium and finds use in a number of ways in explosives, fireworks, matches, fertilizers and metallurgical and chemical processes. Saltpeter occurs as thin, slightly yellowish to whitish, brittle encrustations on the surface in the form of natural efflorescence. In Muktsar District the economic exploitation of salt peter is being carried out at all the area in the district.

Ground-water.– A study of geo hydrological conditions in the Muktsar area indicates that upto 60 metres ground-water occur under unconfined conditions. The water bearing formation mainly include medium to coarse and with subordinate amount of *Kankar*.

1.4 FOREST

An area of 2000 hectares is covered under protected forest, which is 0.14% of total forest area of the state. It shows that district lacking in forest resources.

1.5 ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP

For administrative point of view, the district has been divided into 3subdivision/ Tehsil, 4 Sub Tehsils, 4 blocks. There are 263 Gram Panchayats, 234 inhabited villages.
